6. Budget

2. Problem Statement

- The purpose of the Problem Statement is to show why the proposed program is needed.
 - Demographics factors
 - Cultural Factors
 - Barriers to Access
 - Evidence from studies

Reading the Guidelines

- *Is this the right grant?*
 - consistent with your mission and goals
 - staff expertise and resources to implement the program
 - capacity to administer the funds
 - direct ties to and experience with the target population
 - community support for the proposed program
 - amount of money being offered worth the time and expense involved in applying for it
