POSTER GUIDELINES

Specifications for Poster Presentations

- We recommend posters to be 36 inches by 44 inches (vertical). This is a portrait/ vertical format.
- Poster materials should not extend outside the assigned half-board.
- Include title, author(s), & institution(s) of research at the top center of the poster.
- Your poster should include the following headings: Introduction/Background; Methods; Results; Conclusions; Contact Information
- Your Introduction should make a connection between your content & the conference theme: Building Capacity for STEM Student Success at Hispanic-Serving Institutions.
- Presenters are expected to present their posters during the dedicated presentation session. Exact location will be available in the final conference program.

Tips for Poster Preparation

Posters should stimulate discussion, not give a long presentation. Keep text to a minimum, emphasize graphics, and make sure every item included in your poster is necessary.

- Utilize handouts to supplement your poster.
- Goal: 20% text, 40% graphics, 40% space.
- Make sure ideas flow logically from one
 Do not use all capital letters. section to the next.
- Use charts and graphs to illustrate data (avoid large tables of raw data).
- Use high resolution photographs (web images often will not work).

Additional Recommendations

Be Consistent:

- Keep consistent margins.
- Keep line spacing consistent.
- Keep the color, style, & thickness of borders the same.
- Keep shading consistent.

Test Readability:

- Pick no more than 2–3 fonts (Arial or Verdana) preferred).
- Pick no more than 2–3 colors:
 - Choose your colors to provide a strong contrast & avoid pairing RED & GREEN elements to assist those with RED-GREEN color blindness.
- Title banner should be legible from 20 feet away.
- Body text should legible from 6 feet away.
